RESOLUTION # 27 OF 2023

WHEREAS, THE TOWN OF GHENT CLIMATE SMART COMMUNITIES TASK FORCE ("TASK FORCE") REQUESTS TOWN BOARD AUTHORIZATION TO APPLY ON BEHALF OF THE TOWN FOR A BUILDING DECARBONIZATION GRANT AVAILABLE THROUGH PARTNERS FOR CLIMATE ACTION; AND WHEREAS, THE TOWN OF GHENT ADOPTED A MUNICIPAL GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS INVENTORY IN DECEMBER OF 2022, WHICH DETERMINED SOURCE ONE EMISSIONS (I.E., DIRECT FOSSIL FUEL COMBUSTION) TO BE THE PRIMARY SOURCE OF EMISSIONS FROM TOWN-OWNED FACILITIES; AND WHEREAS, THE TASK FORCE RECOMMENDS CUTTING SOURCE ONE EMISSIONS FROM FACILITIES AS A FIRST STEP IN REDUCING GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS IN THE TOWN; ANDWHEREAS, THE TASK FORCE FURTHER RECOMMENDS PRIORITIZING FACILITY UPGRADES AT THE WEST GHENT COMMUNITY CENTER DUE TO THE NEED FOR IMPROVEMENTS AND BECAUSE THE PUBLIC-FACING NATURE OF THE FACILITY WILL ALLOW THE PUBLIC TO OBSERVE AND APPRECIATE THE BENEFITS OF CLEAN HEATING AND COOLING SYSTEMS FOR MUNICIPAL FACILITIES; ANDWHEREAS, THE GHENT TOWN BOARD PREVIOUSLY AUTHORIZED THE TASK FORCE TO SOLICIT ESTIMATES FOR NECESSARY WORK AND TO WRITE A BUILDING DECARBONIZATION GRANT FROM PARTNERS FOR CLIMATE ACTION TO SUPPORT AN ALTERNATIVE HVAC SYSTEM FOR WEST GHENT COMMUNITY CENTER; AND WHEREAS, AN ESTIMATE WAS OBTAINED WITH A PROJECTED COST OF \$25,368.80 FOR PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION OF FOUR AIR SOURCE HEAT PUMPS; AND WHEREAS, THE COOLING FUNCTIONALITY OF SUCH HEAT PUMPS CCOULD ENABLE THE WEST GHENT COMMUNITY CENTER TO BE UTILIZED DURING SUMMER MONTHS AND IS A STEP TOWARDS DESIGNATING THE FACILITY AS A COOLING CENTER IN CASE OF A HEAT EMERGENCY; AND WHEREAS, A SOLAR ARRAY WITH AMPLE BATTERY BACKUP STORAGE COULD BE CONSIDERED FOR FUTURE FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES TO BOTH OFFSET THE ADDITIONAL ELECTRICITY DEMAND FROM HEAT PUMPS AND ENABLE THE FACILITY TO SERVE AS A FUNCTIONAL COOLING CENTER IN A POWER OUTAGE. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF GHENT, THAT THE TOWN BOARD AUTHORIZES SUBMISSION AND SUPPORTS TASK FORCE'S DECARBONIZATION GRANT APPLICATION TO PARTNERS FOR CLIMATE ACTION SEEKING A MINIMUM OF \$25,368.80 FOR THE PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION OF HEAT PUMPS AT THE WEST GHENT COMMUNITY CENTER.

Broadband- Supervisor Simmons- moving forward with Mid Hudson, permits are coming, meeting next week.

County Report- Supervisor Simmons – budget time, all about finances, staying under the tax cap, labor negotiations ongoing.

Rail Trail- Councilman Myers- The consultants are working on the routing plan through the Village. We met with Mayor Howe and the DPW to make sure the trail construction does not interfere with the sewer project. We also met at Camphill Ghent to look at the potential route through the Camphill property. The engineering and environmental teams have been onsite checking the bridge structures and wetlands. The project is moving along and is little ahead of schedule. The HVRTA annual meeting was a great success with 120 people attending.

Communications Committee- Councilman Barufaldi- fair number of stories and events. Story on the food pantry, Halloween parade was great. Looking to start a Community Day committee of volunteers. The tree lighting is December 1st at 6pm. Menorah lighting December 7th at sundown.

Seniors- Councilman Engel- stated that the group has been active and doing well. Had a chicken BBQ at the boat club. Christmas party planned for 12/6 at Jackson's. Heading to see the Rockett's on 12/13. Senior luncheon to be held at the Chatham Middle School on December 14th.

Parks and Recreation- Supervisor Simmons- tennis courts have been winterized. Holiday banners have been installed. Received reimbursement from the County and State for camp costs and busing. Discussed signs for West Ghent regarding parking.

HIGHWAY:

We have been busy doing final end of the year final preparations for the upcoming winter season. We have 95% of the fleet swapped over winter season. We have been working on the new storage building all the upright post and the two cans I place. We will be working on the roof system next. We have been diligently working on the body swap. At a meeting yesterday I attended with Cornell Local Roads I was notified that the State has revised the green light law to allow municipalities to use the yellow/green combination lights on any of our municipal equipment. We have gotten around our entire road system tending to the fall leaves with 3 units Turbine blower, truck blower and leaf vac trail making sure our ditches and pipes are cleaned to the best of our ability which will reduce our plugged pipe issues throughout the winter season. Put the trailer and dump body on the auction site which ended yesterday day trailer bid is \$4,000 & dump body was \$5,100 along with the roller was \$3,850 that would put us at \$12,450 in sales of the equipment for the year on the \$100,000 we had set aside for equipment purchase price was \$111,265 total sale of equipment will cover this over cost as well hoped and will bank \$1,185. Flags have been taken down and holiday banners have been put up. Tennis nets will be coming down soon. Resolution #28 speed request reduction Harlemville rd east of parkway.

WHEREAS, RESIDENTS LIVING ALONG THAT PORTION OF HARLEMVILLE ROAD LOCATED IN THE TOWN OF GHENT THAT BEGINS AT THE TACONIC STATE PARKWAY AND EXTENDS EAST TO THE TOWN LINE HAVE SUBMITTED A PETITION REQUESTING A SPEED LIMIT REDUCTION FROM THE CURRENT MAXIMUM SPEED OF 45 MPH APPLICABLE TO THE SAID TOWN HIGHWAY (HEREINAFTER THE "SUBJECT HIGHWAY"); AND WHEREAS, THE RESIDENTS REPORT A HIGH VOLUME OF AUTO AND TRUCK TRAFFIC FREQUENTLY TRAVELING ON THE SUBJECT HIGHWAY AT SPEEDS IN EXCESS OF THE CURRENT MAXIMUM; AND WHEREAS, THE SUBJECT HIGHWAY SERVES MANY RESIDENCES AND PROVIDES ACCESS TO THE ART SCHOOL OF COLUMBIA COUNTY, THE HAWTHORNE VALLEY FARMSCAPE ECOLOGY PROGRAM, THE HAWTHORNE VALLEY FARM AND STORE, AND THE HAWTHORNE VALLEY WALDORF SCHOOL; AND WHEREAS, THERE IS A CATTLE CROSSING ON SUBJECT HIGHWAY USED BY HAWTHORNE VALLEY FARM TO MOVE ITS HERD FROM FARM TO PASTURE; AND WHEREAS, THE SUBJECT HIGHWAY ALSO HOSTS A HIGH-VOLUME PEDESTRIAN AND BICYCLE TRAFFIC; AND WHEREAS, PETITIONING RESIDENTS REPORT DANGEROUS CONDITIONS ON THE SUBJECT HIGHWAY DUE TO THE HIGH SPEED OF THE VEHICLE TRAFFIC; ANDWHEREAS, THE GHENT TOWN BOARD HAS DETERMINED THAT A REDUCTION OF THE SPEED LIMIT WOULD IMPROVE SAFETY ON THE SUBJECT HIGHWAY; AND WHEREAS, THE GHENT TOWN BOARD HAS DETERMINED THAT UNDER SUCH CIRCUMSTANCES A SPEED LIMIT REDUCTION IS WARRANTED. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF GHENT THAT THE TOWN BOARD HEREBY REQUESTS A SPEED LIMIT REDUCTION FOR THAT PORTION OF HARLEMVILLE ROAD LOCATED IN THE TOWN OF GHENT THAT BEGINS AT THE TACONIC STATE PARKWAY AND EXTENDS EAST TO THE TOWN LINE; AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION SHALL BE SENT TO THE COLUMBIA COUNTY DPW AND THE COLUMBIA COUNTY TRAFFIC SAFETY BOARD, WITH A REQUEST THAT THE COLUMBIA COUNTY DPW AND THE COLUMBIA COUNTY TRAFFIC SAFETY BOARD TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTION IN 2 CONNECTION WITH REVIEWING THIS MATTER, TOWARD THE GOAL THAT THE SPEED LIMIT BE REDUCED AS REQUESTED HEREIN.
